## **CREATING FAMILY MEMORIES**

November is a great time to create family memories. Consider activities like hiking, baking or cooking together, or visiting a local pumpkin patch or farmers' market. Enjoy quality time with your loved ones! Here's an easy recipe for homemade spaghetti with marinara sauce:

#### Ingredients:

- 8 oz (about 2 cups) of spaghetti
- 1 can (14 oz) of diced tomatoes
- 2 cloves of garlic, minced
- 1/4 cup of olive oil
- 1/2 teaspoon of dried oregano
- 1/2 teaspoon of dried basil
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Grated Parmesan cheese for garnish (optional)

#### Instructions:

1. Cook the spaghetti according to package instructions until it's al dente. Drain and set aside.

2. In a large skillet, heat the olive oil over medium heat. Add the minced garlic and sauté for about 1 minute until it's fragrant.

3. Add the can of diced tomatoes to the skillet, along with the dried oregano and basil. Stir well.
4. Simmer the sauce over low heat for about 10-15 minutes, stirring occasionally. This will allow the flavors to meld together and the sauce to

thicken slightly. Season with salt and pepper to taste.

5. Serve the cooked spaghetti on plates and top with the marinara sauce. You can also sprinkle grated Parmesan cheese on top for extra flavor.

6. Enjoy your homemade spaghetti with marinara sauce!
