



Established in 2007, Constellation Schools: Westside Community School of the Arts offers visual and performing arts instruction as part of the regular school day. Students in Kindergarten through Grade 4 receive 30 minutes of visual arts and 30 minutes of music instruction daily. Starting in Grade 4, students can participate in orchestra. Students in Grades

5-8 spend one hour each day focusing on visual art, vocal art, band or orchestra. In addition to arts instruction and an academic curriculum aligned with Ohio standards, students participate in regular PE and character education.

The school culture promotes high expectations for both academics and behavior with programs to support social and emotional growth. Students experience small class sizes and have a range of sports, clubs, and extracurricular activities such as Basketball, Cheerleading, Volleyball, Girls on the Run, and more. The school partners with parents and community organizations to support and extend learning beyond the classroom.

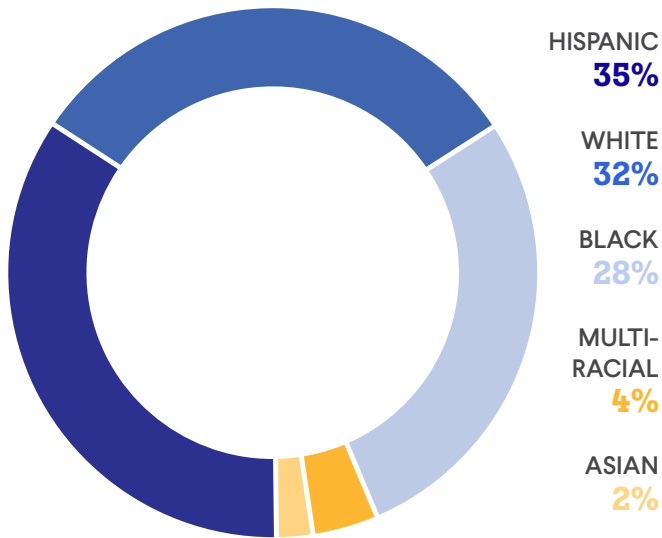

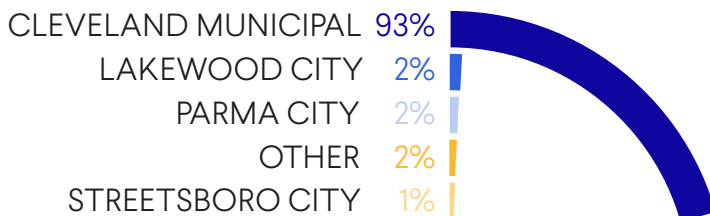

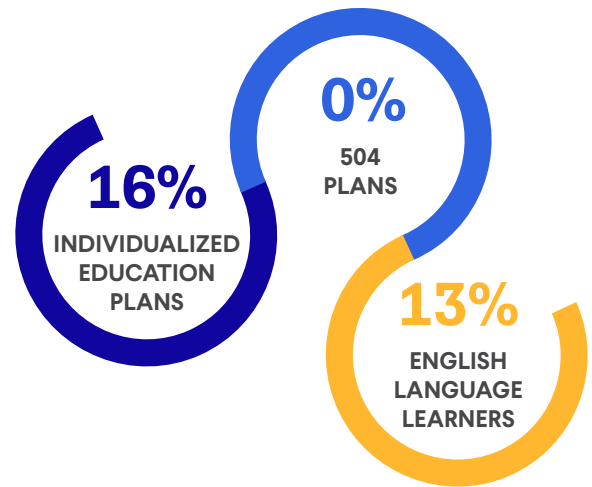
DISTRICTS OF RESIDENCE

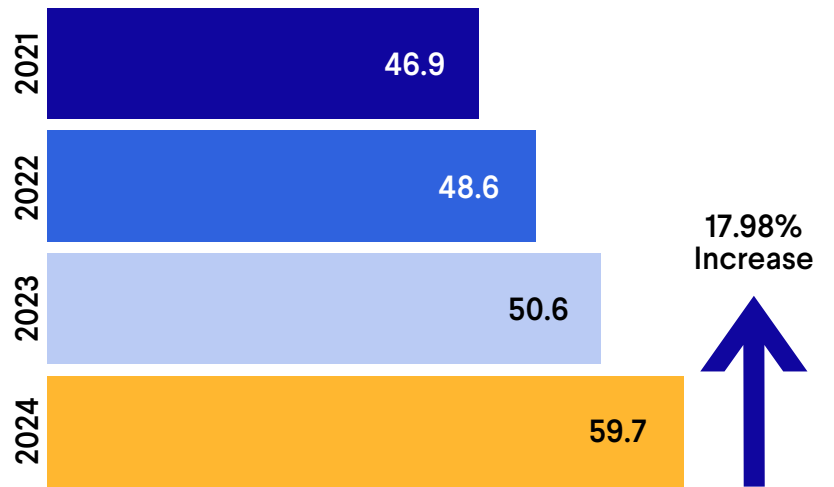
